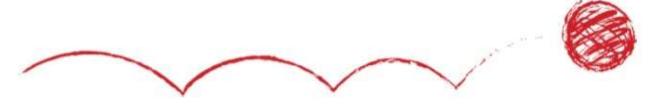




Giving kids a sporting chance.

Jumpstart changes that.



Jumpstart's Vision:



Canadian Tire Jumpstart is a nationally registered charity dedicated to removing financial barriers so kids across Canada have the opportunity to get off the sidelines and into the game.



Program Delivery



Canadian Tire Store creates a Jumpstart Chapter and develops relationships with Community Organizations



Community Jumpstart Chapters identify children in need, complete submission form and forward for approval



Payment is mailed directly to a particular community partner or organization



Child participates in program



What & who we fund:



- Children between 4-18 years of age are eligible
- Activities must involve physical activity
- Funding covers registration fees, associated transportation and equipment costs required for participation
- Support provided per child per submission period is up to \$300 (\$600 max per year)





National Statistics



- Over 840,394 children assisted since 2005
- 310 local Jumpstart Chapters across Canada
- We work with over 3100 local community partners





Brockville & Prescott Jumpstart Chapter



In 2013 we:

- Helped 818 local children get in the game
- Invested over \$50,000 in facilitating our children to get active

Brockville & Prescott since inception (2005) 4030 kids helped with investment of over \$250K

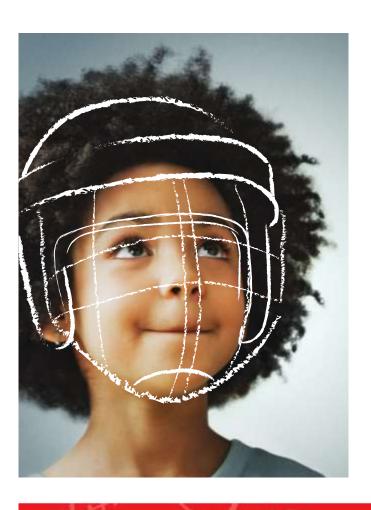






A few Stories.....
